

Note verbale dated 22 March 2019 from the Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna) addressed to the Secretary-General

The Permanent Mission of the Russian Federation to the United Nations (Vienna), in accordance with article IV of the Convention on Registration of Objects Launched into Outer Space (General Assembly resolution 3235 (XXIX), annex), has the honour to transmit registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in February 2019 and also on the space objects that ceased to exist during that period (see annex).







## Annex

## Registration data on space launches by the Russian Federation in February 2019\*

- 1. In February 2019, the Russian Federation did not launch any space objects included, in accordance with established practice and its international obligations, in the register of space objects launched by the Russian Federation and over which it exercises jurisdiction and control.
- 2. In February 2019, the Russian Federation launched the following space object on behalf of a foreign client:
  - On 21 February 2019, the Earth remote sensing satellite EgyptSat-A (Egypt) was launched from the Baikonur launch site by a Soyuz-2-1b carrier rocket with a Fregat booster.
- 3. As at 2400 hours Moscow time on 28 February 2019, no space objects of the Russian Federation had been found to have ceased to exist in Earth orbit in February 2019.
